A few notes on the program

Burkhardt Reiter studied composition at the Eastman School of Music, Duquesne University, and the University of Pittsburgh where he earned his Ph.D. in Composition and Analysis. Burkhardt's music was recognized at the Wellesley Composer's Conference, June in Buffalo, the College Music Society, and other regional and national performance entities. After a career in teaching electronic music and music theory at the University of Pittsburgh and other colleges, Burkhardt transitioned into Software Development.

Juwon Adenuga - Johnson Oluwajuwon Adenuga is a musician with a keen interest in African music. He is a composer, pianist, and percussionist (Gangan and Djembe).

His interests and research are on the different approaches to effectively engage with and revitalize Yoruba musical forms and styles. His appreciation of the different styles of Yoruba music can be attributed to his early engagement with African musical styles. He studied jazz piano at Peter Kings College of Music (PKCM). He obtained a diploma in piano performance at the Musical Society of Nigeria (MUSON) School of Music. He studied for the bachelor's program with a specialization in Music Composition at the University of Ibadan, Oyo, Nigeria. His compositions, to mention a few, includes Abáméta, Olúda, Awéléwá, Muse, Olugbon (instrumental and vocal), and Palmwhyne. His arrangement includes the first movement of Phil Woods' sonata and a five-track project titled Magnified—an arrangement of different Yoruba melodies.

He is currently a Ph.D. student in the Jazz studies program at the University of Pittsburgh.

ÀRÈ, the Yoruba word for sojourner, is a short composition representing the shortness of human life, set in an unending loop of time with different phases of experiences. This is work is dedicated to my teacher, the Late Dr. Oyebade Dosunmu, who was an alumnus of the University of Pittsburgh.

Emmanuel Berrido (b.1986) is a Dominican-American composer with a passion for telling stories through sound. His work has been performed by a variety of artists including the JACK Quartet and the Amernet String Quartet, cellists Megan Chartier, and Craig Mehler, violinist Peter Sheppard Skærved, and the FIU Wind Ensemble. Recent experiences have included participation at the American Composer's Orchestra EarShot Readings with the Grand Rapids Symphony, the New Music Miami Festival, the Indiana State University Contemporary Music Festival, and the Ball State University Festival of New Music. He was the recipient of the Louis Smadbeck Composition Prize in Ithaca, NY, for his work "Bend the Knee" for brass quintet, the Ithaca College Orchestral Composition Competition for his "Danza Ritual" for orchestra, and the 2022 Pittsburgh Composer's Project by ensemble NAT 28. His composition mentors include Eric Moe, Jorge Villavicencio Grossmann, Evis Sammoutis, and Orlando Jacinto García. Berrido is currently pursuing a PhD in Composition and Music Theory at the University of Pittsburgh and serves as staff for the Valencia International Performance Academy and Festival, and the New Music on the Point festival.

Roger Zahab enjoys instigating fairly complex and unpredictable interactions through his activities as composer, violinist/violist, improvisor, conductor, teacher, and writer. As performer/conductor he has fostered premieres of more than 200 works and his repertoire, spanning some 700 years from Guillaume de Machaut to the present. www.rogerzahab.net
